Aims of the course program	Status of the Republic of Macedonia as state candidate to join NATO, as well as participation of members of Macedonian armed forces and police in NATO missions and in Peacekeeping forces of UN, underlined the necessity of learning rules and norms of the International Humanitarian Law. The aim of this subject is for students to be familiar with content of provisions of international treaties and basic principles of IHL, as well as to adopt the necessary knowledge and techniques for solving issues of International Humanitarian Law in practice. The knowledge gained would enable them for competent participation in the procedure regarding breaching of the concrete provisions of IHL, as well as in recognizing of perpetrators of war crimes, crimes against humanity and crime of genocide.
