The Department of Social, Political and Legal Sciences, like other Departments at the Faculty of Security, was established with the Decision of the Teaching and Scientific Council of the Police Academy in 2005.

There have been a lot of meetings of the Department since its establishment, related to the successful organization and realization of lectures and tutorials in the areas it covers, as well as the scientific, research and publishing activities and other topical issues regarding the work of the Faculty of Security.

The syllabi for the subjects within the Department cover the latest scientific achievements in the corresponding sciences, which enables the students to acquire adequate knowledge, skills and abilities, thus becoming competent in the corresponding areas.

This Department covers the scientific area of social sciences which encompasses the fields of legal sciences, economic sciences (the areas of political economy and finances), political sciences (the areas of contemporary political systems and diplomacy), security sciences and sociology. The field of legal sciences covers several subjects in the areas of: International Public Law, EU Law, Human Rights and Freedoms, as well as the areas of Administrative Law, Introduction to Law and Constitutional Law. The Department also encompasses the areas of

Methodology of Researching Security Phenomena, International Security and International Relations etc.

Due to the non-existence of a separate Department of Foreign Languages, the scientific area of humanistic sciences was attached to the Department of Social, Political and Legal sciences. It includes the field of the science of language and the areas of Anglistics (English Language), Macedonistics (Macedonian Language and Speech Culture), Germanistics (German Language) and Romanistics (French Language).

Since 2003, the Department's members have published over 20 textbooks, supplementary materials and monographies in corresponding areas. They have published around 300 scientific and professional papers in international and domestic journals, and have participated in over 250 domestic and international scientific conferences, symposia, round tables etc. They have participated in over 50 national or international scientific and research projects, in the capacity of project members or project managers. Some members of the Department are acknowledged as renowned experts in their fields in the wider region, and some of them are even members of renowned domestic institutions, associations and international scientific associations.
