The abstract should be a single paragraph, double-spaced, 11 pt. The abstract should be between 300 and 500 words.

Text

Times New Roman font, size 11 pt., 1.5 spacing, justified, 20.000 – 30.000 characters (with spaces)

Text structure

Titles of chapters, sections and subsections should be written in 14 pt. font size, bold. Citation source should be made by APA style citation for example: Researchers have pointed out that the lack of trained staff is a common barrier to providing adequate health education (Roy, 1982) .

Titles of chapters, sections and subsections should be written in 14 pt. font size, bold.

Tables and figures

Tables and figures: heading is above the table, 10 pt, bold, justified, 1.5 line spacing, numbered sequentially as you refer to them in the text (Table 1, Table 2, etc.), *example: Table 1: Heading (Source: Example, 2011) - Figures: heading is under the table, 10 pt, bold, justified, 1.5 line spacing, numbered sequentially as you refer to them in the text (Figure 1, Figure 2, etc.)

*example: Figure 1: Heading (Source: Example, 2011)

References

The sources should be listed in alphabetical order and according to APA Citation Style. The APA style includes three kinds of information in in-text citations.

1. The author's last name*
2. The work's date of publication*
3. The page number, appears only in a citation to a direct quotation.
